- **Active Recall:** Test yourself regularly on the material. Use flashcards or practice questions to enhance memory.
- Spaced Repetition: Spread your study sessions over several days or weeks to better retain information.
- **Practice Papers:** Work through past exam papers to familiarize yourself with the format and to practice time management.
- Mix It Up: Alternate between subjects or topics to keep your study sessions dynamic and maintain your focus.
 - **Mind Maps:** Use mind maps to visually organize information, helping you to see connections between concepts.
 - **Teach Others:** Explain the material to someone else. Teaching is a great way to reinforce your own understanding.
 - **Take Breaks:** Avoid burnout by taking short breaks. Try studying for 25 minutes and then taking a 5-minute break.
 - **Healthy Habits:** Stay hydrated, eat brain-boosting foods, and get plenty of sleep to keep your mind sharp.


Clock changes at the end of March

Safeguarding Spotlight: Keeping Your Child Safe on TikTok

TikTok is a dynamic platform where children and teenagers engage with a global community through creative video content. While it can be a source of entertainment and self-expression, it's important for parents to be aware of the potential risks associated with its use.



What to Watch Out For:

- Viral Challenges: While many challenges are harmless, others can be dangerous or inappropriate. Be cautious of trends that encourage harmful behaviors, such as consuming inedible substances or participating in risky acts.
- Inappropriate Content: Videos may contain sexual, violent, or other adult themes despite TikTok's age rating of 13+. Engaging with such content, even negatively, can lead to more showing up in your child's feed.
- Privacy Concerns: Users can encounter issues with privacy if personal information
 is shared. It's crucial to keep accounts private and educate children about the risks of
 sharing personal details.

Seven Steps to Enhance Safety:

- 1. **Use Family Pairing:** This feature allows you to control safety settings and monitor your child's TikTok usage from your own device. <u>Set up Family Pairing</u>
- 2. **Keep Accounts Private:** Ensure that only approved followers can view videos your child posts. <u>Make an account private</u>
- 3. **Enable Restricted Mode:** This setting helps filter out inappropriate content from your child's feed. **Enable Restricted Mode**
- 4. **Set Time Limits:** Manage how long your child can spend on TikTok each day to prevent excessive use. <u>Manage Screen Time</u>
- 5. **Restrict In-App Purchases:** Use device settings to prevent unauthorized purchases through the app. Manage spending on iOS | Manage spending on Android
- 6. **Manage Interactions:** Adjust settings to limit who can comment, duet, or message your child.
- 7. **Educate and Communicate:** Teach your child how to report inappropriate content and discuss online safety regularly. Report a problem


